A Brief History of OAA

The Oakland Art Association, a non-profit organization, was founded in 1957. Annual exhibits were held in the (former) Oakland Art Museum as well as various venues in and about Oakland. An annual Jack London Square festival hosted the OAA exhibit along with other participants.

A small space on Piedmont Avenue housed an office as well as receiving/ jurying space. Each year a profitable Small Format show was held before Christmas.

About 1966, St. Mary's College in Moraga needed a responsible group to maintain and staff their gallery. OAA filled the requirements gaining three rooms to hold on-going exhibits - also staffing when St. Mary's held exhibits using two of the rooms. The exclusive one room was the office. receiving room display of rental stock, etc. Two people were hired part time and volunteers filled in with 3 hours a month duty. This was mandatory in order to remain an "exhibiting member". All volunteer duties were duly recorded.

In 1973, a fire consumed the Art Gallery and it was closed indefinitely. They later constructed a new building to house the Hearst Gallery and hired a professional group to maintain and staff it.

In the meanwhile, OAA found a wonderful space in the Claremont Hotel lobby entry. Rentals and sales thrived once more using the tried and true volunteer methods along with the two parttime staffers. Membership was up to 300+ including "patrons" who supported the organization (but could not exhibit).

In 1986, when the Claremont changed hands and needed the gallery space for expansion, we had to vacate and find a new gallery. An empty store at 3738-40 Grand Avenue became the next "home" of OAA. Once again enthusiasm prevailed and the attractive displays drew customers and income.

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OAA History

In 1994 the landlord raised the rent beyond the price OAA could manage and the gallery was closed. Sadly many members left and OAA had no hope or enough funds to sustain a suitable gallery.

Exhibit Rules

CHAIR: John Mallon

<u>RECEIVING</u>: Friday, January 18, 2008 from 10 AM until 12 noon at the Presbyterian Church, 4101 Park Blvd., Oakland. Enter parking lot from Hampel Street.

JUROR: Electra Long (www.electralong.com)

ACCEPTED WORKS: Pick up at the Presbyterian Church on Friday March 14, 2008 between 10 AM and 12 noon.

ENTRIES:

Entries will be two dimensional; 16"x 20" minimum and 36"x 36" maximum.

Only 1 entry accepted per member.

Because only 7 "large" (i.e. over 24"X30") works can be displayed in the show space, only the first 7 "large" pieces will be accepted, unless specifically allowed by the Show Chair.

Works restricted to original work - no class work or copies.

Nudes and political statements are not accepted (venue requirement).

All work must be for sale.

The Chamber reserves the right to reject any work from the show for any reason.

- Any work shown at a Chamber of Commerce Show **prior to** January 2005 may be shown again at this show. Any work having won a cash award in any OAA show is not eligible to receive another cash award but may receive a merit award.
- To be entered as a single work, any grouping of 2 or more works must be mounted within a single frame which meets the overall size requirements.

ENTRY FEE: \$8.00 per entry.

FRAMING:

No wide (may not exceed 3") or elaborate frames will be accepted.

Mats must be clean and well cut.

Frames must be clean, sturdy and no protruding screw eyes or hangers will be allowed.

Works larger than 24" x 30" (if covered) must be under plastic instead of glass.

LABELS: Must be filled out completely and affixed to the upper left hand corner on the back of the entry.

PLEASE TYPE OR PRINT LEGIBLY!

AWARDS: First award \$100; Second award \$50; Third award \$25. Merit awards are given at the discretion of the Juror.

INSURANCE: A waiver must be signed on receiving day.

SALES:

- All sales made during the show and/or 30days following the close of the show (if the work was seen by the buyer at the show) will be handled by the Treasurer (Stan Cohen 510 553-3003).
- OAA policy is that no change will be made in the price (in connection with this show) after the work is accepted.

The artist agrees that 30% of the sale price will be taken as a contribution to OAA.

Sales tax of 8.75% will be added to all sales.
