# Nancy Sears — OAA Member Profile


I was born in Illinois, delivered by my great grandmother, a retired doctor. My parents separated and my grandmother, mother and I came west to Palo Alto to live. At eighteen I became the draftsman for a young Hewlett Packard. I left to attend the Academy of Advertising Art, now the Academy of Art University, in San Francisco where I trained to be a graphic designer. Patterson and Hall, a large art service in the city, hired me and I spent two years there before taking a job in Palo Alto with the Pepsi Cola Scholarship Program that tested high school seniors nationally for awards of college scholarships, later adapted as the

National Merit Scholarship Program.

Marriage followed along with four children. We lived in Palo Alto and I did as much freelance design work as possible for local printers. Contact with the largest print company led to working for their newly formed publishing division. I'd always had a strong interest in typography and this job as art director and book designer brought sixteen years of the perfect job.

After early retirement I began taking classes at Foothill Community College and was accepted as a junior transfer at UC

Berkeley. I moved to Oakland and earned a BA degree in the Practice of Art in 1991. Then I began to paint in earnest. Oil paint is my primary medium. Subjects are landscapes, urban and rural. I rely on light, color and shape, filtering the image through my vision with no attempt for a camera likeness. I paint on site as well as from photographs or sketches at



home. To work with a free flow of expression and allow the brush to speak, meant overcoming the intentional precision that had been required as a graphic designer. 

- Probably because of the slower show schedule, Chamber of Commerce show chairman John Mallon faced a huge challenge with the show that went up in late September. TOO MANY PAINTINGS!! The rules for the next show (see next months newsletter) will address the problem either by limiting the number of entries or by requiring artists to return to the church to pick up artwork eliminated by the judge.


