the docks a lot looking for interesting reflections and patterns of sunshine and shadow. I don't want to be photo realistic at all; just capture the light.

For the past year I've also done many monotypes. I use Plexiglas with water color paint, crayons, inks and oil paints. I like the more abstract, blurred, pulled look

you just can't get by painting. I do multiple plates for each print without a press and have invented a few of my own methods. I'd love to learn more about print making, but full time work keeps getting in the way.

As for my brother George, he is now a very well known artist in Hawaii with a studio up the Palolo Valley to

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die for. And he is one of the best teachers I've ever had. I've gone on many of his workshops to the Italian hill towns. He has always been very supportive. It was my parent's fault to designate a single family artist. So turn off the television or computer and put out some paint and paper!
