### Leonard Breger Critiques (a hidden gem): Yin Marsh

Editors Note: As we all know OAA is all about arranging public venues for members to show and sell their art. What is not widely recognized is OAA's involvement in the Breger Critiques, which Yin Marsh spotlights in the following article.

Leonard Breger, a wellknown local artist who is well versed not only in the history of art, but also in science and music. He has been coming to the Kensington Community Center four or five times a year for several years. The space is paid for and donated by the artists who paint there every Wednesday, most of whom are OAA members. The cost of the Critiques themselves is underwritten by OAA, with all participants paying a small fee which usually covers less than half the full cost. These critiques are open to any and all who are interested in improving their artwork. The members who have attended find his presentations stimulating and provocative. You leave his sessions with a clearer view of creativity.

For every session Breger prepares educational materials that opens our eyes to important artists, methods and philosophies that many of us have not even thought about.

The critique portion addresses recent work of each participant, with the whole group having opportunity to interact with encouragement for the artist. Breger moderates these discussions and provides a provocative look at art from many standpoints and enlightens artists about areas not normally discussed. His

intention is for all of us to expand our potential, to reach higher levels, and be more authentic in our expression. Occasionally, this may seem unsettling, but to be creative in art requires some risk-taking, and most artists are committed enough that they accept a measure of discomfort in the search for stronger and more compelling painting. Plan to attend—(OAA's personal stimulus program). Get inspired!

Artists will bring all their own supplies (including tables & free-standing panels, etc.) There is no fee for the space at Jack London, although Pro Arts charges \$140 per artist to register for Open Studios. There may be an additional fee, which will be equally shared, for liability insurance. There will also be a nominal charge for common postcards and marketing materials. Parking under Barnes & Noble is \$15 maximum for the day. Street parking is also available and free on Sundays.

**RECEIVING:** Friday March 19th from 10 AM until 11 AM at the Presbyterian Church, 4101 Park Blvd., Oakland. Enter parking lot from Hampel Street.

JUROR: To be announced

ACCEPTED WORKS: Pick up at the Presbyterian Church on Friday May 21st, 2010 between 10 AM and 11AM.

**ENTRIES:** Only the first 21 entries will be accepted due to space limitations. Only 1 entry will be accepted per member, unless too few pieces are entered before the 11 AM deadline, in which case the Show Chairman **may** accept additional works provided they are immediately available, up to a grand total of 21 entries.

Entries will be two dimensional; 16"x 20" min. and 36"x 36" max. - nominal size including mats.

**Artworks depicting iconic scenes of San Francisco are not appropriate for this venue!** If entered, artwork in this category may be rejected at the sole discretion of the show chairman.

Because only 7 "large" (i.e. over 24"X30") works can be displayed in the show space, only the first 7 "large" pieces will be accepted, unless specifically allowed by the Show Chair.

Works restricted to original work – no class work or copies. Nudes and political statements are not accepted (venue requirement). All work must be for sale. The Chamber reserves the right to reject any work from the show for any reason.

Any work shown at a Chamber of Commerce Show **prior to** January 2007 may be shown again at this show. Any work having won a cash award in any OAA show is not eligible to receive another cash award but may receive a merit award.

To be entered as a single work, any grouping of 2 or more works must be mounted within a single frame which meets the overall size requirements.

**ENTRY FEE:** \$8.00 per entry.

**FRAMING:** No wide (may not exceed 3") or elaborate frames will be accepted.

Mats must be clean and well cut and frames must be clean, sturdy and no protruding screw eyes or hangers will be allowed.

Works larger than 24" x 30" (if covered) must be under plastic instead of glass.

**LABELS:** Must be filled out completely and affixed to the upper left hand corner on the back of the entry.

#### PLEASE TYPE OR PRINT LEGIBLY!

**AWARDS:** First award \$100; Second award \$50; Third award \$25. Merit awards are given at the discretion of the Juror.

**INSURANCE:** A waiver must be signed on receiving day.

#### SALES:

All sales made during the show and/or 30days following the close of the show (if the work was seen by the buyer at the show) will be handled by the Sales Chairman Stan Cohen 510 533-3003.

OAA policy is that no change will be made in the price (in connection with this show) after the work is accepted.

The artist agrees that 30% of the sale price will be taken as a contribution to OAA.

Sales tax of 9.75% will be added to all sales.
