### **Luncheon Speaker Leonard Breger**

### A Personal Profile by Longtime OAA member Stan Cohen

I met Len in 1967, when we were both actively involved with the National Art Education Conference held at the San Francisco Hilton. As the Local Arrangements Chair, I was responsible for making sure each event had the equipment, time and space requested by the Presenters. Most of the speakers or demonstrators asked for an amplifier and one slide projector, but Mr. Breger asked for a list of equipment that all but emptied our supply room. Luckily there were no other events on the evening that he and his students from Lick-Wilmerding High School were scheduled for a "Sound and Light Show" in the Main Ballroom. After dinner, the conference group of several hundred teachers walked across the Mezzanine for the entertainment. The Ballroom had been cleared of all furniture and was completely darkened. Suddenly recorded music flowed from many speakers and a most amazing and unexpected colorful and playful light began to grow, change and merge on the floor, walls and ceiling from projectors placed around the room. Colors, shapes and patterns moved and interacted with the music. Some images appeared to bubble and condense into new and alive forms. Slides of nature overlaid fanciful cutouts of color transparencies. The teen-age students improvised and moved their images to overlay other pro-

jections. The result was a stunning demonstration of the use of the cutting-edge technology of the day, in a beautiful, memorable hour of color and sound, presented with artful spirit by a group of talented students led by a daring and creative teacher.

Years passed and I lost touch with Leonard. In the 1990's, when we had both retired, he gained a reputation as mentor for local artists who wanted to improve and grow through critique sessions on an ongoing basis.

In 1998, OAA invited Breger to a single open session for members that generated interest in having a continuing series of critiques. A major problem was the space to meet on a regular ba-

sis, and the cost involved. At that point, a group of OAA members requested a small part of our association budget to support periodic critiques for interested artists in the organization. The group also offered, free, the studio space for the critiques, which they were already renting for their weekly painting sessions at the Kensington Recreation Center.

With OAA funding, (partially

repaid by participants,) Breger began meeting in 1999, with the group in Kensington every two months to review their artwork and to learn what a Master Teacher could add to their knowledge. We are pleased that the series is continuing this year.

Historically, the concepts of "criticism", "critics" and "critiques" have had a troubling connotation for artists who may

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have suffered from an "Art Critic's" sneering, or negative reviews of their exhibited work. Our own critiques have none of that.

My own experience with Breger, (and I believe most of the other artists who attend would agree,) has been one of caring encouragement, delivered with wit and humor. True, he has a limited patience for excuses and "stuck-ness". He is also not overwhelmed by slick technique. But, for each individual, he looks for growth, for personal expression, and for honest attempts to reach further and dig deeper.

At age 90, Breger is still a daring and creative teacher and artist. OAA should be proud to have provided it's members this unique opportunity to learn.
