Over the years, June has participated in many workshops and her hard work paid off as she continues to prefect her art. Since retiring, Jim has found that he enjoys painting with watercolors, and began entering shows and wining awards with his work. Jim and June are both past Presidents of the Oakland Art Association,

and currently serve on the board of directors.
Both are also members of the Valley Arts Gallery in Walnut Creek.
June and Jim have traveled in their RV across the country painting landscapes and southwest buildings, but the Monterey Bay area remains their favorite place to paint.

# Upcoming Shows 100 Pieces need to be entered in July

As our president Bobbe Anderson recently observed, the association is faced with an "embarrassment of riches" this summer. As it turns out during the month of July, Oakland Art Association will be hanging three major shows, so it is very important that all members start planning now to make sure that we have enough QUALITY artwork to keep the shows at the outstanding level that the gallery managers have learned to expect from OAA.

The date is not firmly fixed, but the month long **OAA Small Format Show at** the Rockridge Library will kick off the frenzy early in the month of July. Watch next month's bulletin for the exact dates and rules concerning the small format show but you should certainly start dusting off your artwork with overall outside dimensions (including frame) not less

than 8 x 10 inches (80 square Tina Nelson are chairing the inches) nor more than 18 x 24 inches (430 square inches). Up to 3 pieces of work may be accepted from each member. The take-in for this show is planned to be at the Presbyterian Church. Stan Cohen with the help of his lovely wife Naomi, will chair the small format show and if you have questions please call Stan at (510) 533-3003.

The Orinda library show will also go up mid July for approximately one month. As with the Rockridge show the precise dates and rules will be published in the June newsletter. The Orinda show will accept up to 2 pieces from each member, all work to fall under the maximum size of 36 X 40 inch (1440 square inches). The take in for the show will be at the library (located at 24 Orinda Way in Orinda). Next month's newsletter will include rules and directions. June Coy and

The Oakland Chamber of Commerce show is of course the Association's mainstay show, and a regularly scheduled edition will hang on July 20. Rules for the July 20 show will essentially be the same as the rules published on page 5 of this newsletter. The take in for the chamber show is set for Friday July 20 at the Presbyterian Church.

If you have been keeping up with the math, the average OAA member will need to present at least 2 pieces of art during July if OAA is to keep pace with the demand for your art! Please start planning and START PAINTING.

ACCEPTED WORKS: Pick up at the Presbyterian Church on Friday March 16th.2007 between 10 AM and 12 noon.

#### **ENTRIES:**

- Entries will be two dimensional; 16"x 20" minimum and 36"x 36" maximum.
- Up to 3 entries accepted per member, but only 1 of the 3 may be "large" (i.e. over 30").
- Works restricted to original work no class work or copies.
- Nudes and political statements are not accepted (venue requirement).
- All work must be for sale.
- Up to three works may be submitted; three may be accepted.
- The Chamber reserves the right to reject any work from the show for any reason.
- Any work shown at a Chamber of Commerce Show prior to 2004 may be shown again at this show.
   Any work having won a cash award in any OAA show is not eligible to receive another cash award but may receive a merit award.
- To be entered as a single work, any grouping of 2 or more works must be mounted within a single frame which meets the overall size requirements.

**ENTRY FEE:** \$8.00 per entry.

#### FRAMING:

- No wide (may not exceed 3") or elaborate frames will be accepted.
- Mats must be clean and well cut.
- Frames must be clean, sturdy and no protruding screw eyes or hangers will be allowed.
- Works larger than 24" x 30" (if covered) must be under plastic instead of glass.

<u>LABELS:</u> Must be filled out completely and affixed to the upper left hand corner on the back of the entry.

PLEASE TYPE OR PRINT LEGIBLY!

**AWARDS:** First award \$100; Second award \$50; Third award \$25. Merit awards are given at the discretion of the Juror.

**INSURANCE:** A signed waiver must be on file with the Membership Chairman or be filled out and signed on receiving day.

#### SALES:

- All sales made during the show and/or 30days following the close of the show (if the work was seen by the buyer at the show) will be handled by the Treasurer (Stan Cohen 510 553-3003).
- OAA policy is that no change will be made in the price (in connection with this show) after the work is accepted.
- The artist agrees that 30% of the sale price will be taken as a contribution to OAA.
- Sales tax of 8.75% will be added to all sales.
