Five Foot Six at the Golden Mean

While helping hang the most recent John Muir show, I got in a conversation with several OAA members and the Hospital Co-coordinator about the proper height to hang paintings. "Look for the horizon, the focal point, or the Golden Mean," I suggested, "Then measure 5 feet, six inches to that spot, and that's where the painting should be hung." Sure enough, we went back and applied that rule to the pieces being hung, and they looked just right! The best part is that, when a variety of kinds of paintings are hung, they are easy to deal with, and are at an eye level that is appropriate for most people. Even better, the eye is drawn most

often right into the painting. Look at your own work; isn't that point often the most interesting part of your composition? Hanging Committee, give this a try!

I didn't make this up on my own; it was something that I learned when I took a gallery design class in Southern California. I was the Cultural Arts Coordinator for the City of Newport Beach, and among other duties, I was in charge of selecting and mounting exhibitions at the two city galleries. One was a very grand space at our main public library, and the other at our city hall. They were changed out from a

month to six week periods. Artists submitted their portfolios to me, and at least three times a year we mounted large juried shows.

At that time, I wasn't spending much serious time making art or finding exhibition opportunities for my work. I did however learn a whole lot about the psychology and angst of what artists go through when they try to present

their work for show, and sometimes sale. The process of going through a juried exhibition was painful for some, and being rejected was terribly difficult for many. The person selecting the pieces simply doesn't have the same emotional investment in the work that the artist does.

These experiences helped me weather all kinds of entries into various shows, accepted or not, because I knew that different judges had very different approaches to choosing work. Some choose work that is close to what they un-

derstand best. Some judges look for excellence in presentation (framing, etc.), while others don't care about that at all. What an artist needs to develop, is an appreciation for their own work even if a particular judge does not award it a place or even include it in the show. Serious artists keep trying, even though it is sometimes very difficult.

For the past six years I have been working to develop my own sensibility, style, and feeling of comfort with various media. I've worked in water-

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color, acrylic, Monoprints, various mixed media techniques, and have most recently been creating "quiltlike" hangings where I begin with painted or printed fabric, collaged with paper, fabric, and paints. I'm experimenting with different substrates, such as muslin, silk, and even Tyvek, which gives a marvelous texture. I must get bored easily, because I'm always looking for the next idea!

Look for my work on an ongoing basis at 4th Street Studios in Berkeley!

The speaker will be Mr. Barry Levin, founder of The Imagery Group. The presentation will include an informative slide show and lecture on reproducing your art, from scanning through the printing process. You will learn about each step, why it's important, and how to tell the good ones from the "not so good". Mr

Levin works with artists in all mediums making Giclées that match their original art. As artists, it's important to understand how we make our art - it's also important to understand how to reproduce it properly!

Editors note: Although Mr Levin makes his living providing the described services, he promises that the presentation will be "on point" for its educational value and will not be a "sales pitch". Outside the formal presentation however, Mr. Levin would undoubtedly be happy to discuss how his services might relate to your specific needs.

OAA Holiday Art Sale December 4th

A group of OAA volunteers including president Yin Marsh, Tina Nelson, Ikuko Boyland and Gisela Volkmer has been busy planning and organizing a Holiday Art and Gift Sale. The sale will be held at the Park Avenue Presbyterian Church (4101 Park Blvd. in Oakland) on Saturday December 4th between 10 am and 4 pm. The response so far has been good; 14 members have already signed up. The event is open to all OAA members (as space will allow) with each artist paying a simple up front fee of \$15 (no commissions) to help defray the space rental and promotion costs. Artists will handle their own sales de-

tails and will provide snacks and drinks to a common area.

Members are welcome to display in groups so that not every artist needs to spend the entire day "manning the table". Participants will of course be offering some original art for sale, but unlike other OAA sponsored events, will also offer prints, reproductions and cards. The goal is to emphasize art fairly priced but at the low end of the price range specifically directed toward Holiday gifts. Participants are also encouraged to sell not only 2 dimensional works but also jewelry and any other 3 dimensional works they have

produced.

Promotion of this event will of course be the key to its success — posters for neighborhood shops, and a postcard blitz are planned in addition to the more usual newspaper and internet announcements. Exhibit Rules

RECEIVING: Friday September 17th from 10 AM until 11 AM at the Presbyterian Church, 4101 Park Blvd., Oakland. Enter parking lot from Hampel Street.

JUROR: Larry Wilson

ACCEPTED WORKS: Pick up at the Presbyterian Church on Friday November 19th, 2010 between 10 AM and 11AM.

ENTRIES: Two entries will be accepted per member, however only a total of 21 entries will be shown due to space limitations. If necessary, the juror will first reduce the field of entries to 21, with the goal that only one artwork per submitting member should be removed. In the event that work is rejected, artists must be available to pick up the overflow pieces at 11 AM.

Entries will be two dimensional; 16"x 20" min. and 36"x 36" max. - nominal size including mats.

Artworks depicting iconic scenes of San Francisco are not appropriate for this venue! If entered, artwork in this category may be rejected at the sole discretion of the show chairman.

Because only 7 "large" (i.e. over 24"X30") works can be displayed in the show space, only the first 7 "large" pieces will be accepted, unless specifically allowed by the Show Chair.

Works restricted to original work – no class work or copies. Nudes and political statements are not accepted (venue requirement). All work must be for sale. The Chamber reserves the right to reject any work from the show for any reason.

Any work shown at a Chamber of Commerce Show **prior to** January 2007 may be shown again at this show. Any work having won a cash award in any OAA show is not eligible to receive another cash award but may receive a merit award.

To be entered as a single work, any grouping of 2 or more works must be mounted within a single frame which meets the overall size requirements.

ENTRY FEE: \$8.00 per entry.

FRAMING: No wide (may not exceed 3") or elaborate frames will be accepted.

Mats must be clean and well cut and frames must be clean, sturdy and no protruding screw eyes or hangers will be allowed.

Works larger than 24" x 30" (if covered) must be under plastic instead of glass.

LABELS: Must be filled out completely and affixed to the upper left hand corner on the back of the entry.

PLEASE TYPE OR PRINT LEGIBLY!

AWARDS: First award \$100; Second award \$50; Third award \$25. Merit awards are given at the discretion of the Juror.

INSURANCE: A waiver must be signed on receiving day.

SALES:

All sales made during the show and/or 30days following the close of the show (if the work was seen by the buyer at the show) will be handled by the Sales Chairman Stan Cohen 510 533-3003.

OAA policy is that no change will be made in the price (in connection with this show) after the work is accepted. The artist agrees that 30% of the sale price will be taken as a contribution to OAA. Sales tax of 9.75% will be added to all sales.
