In Remembrance of Kay Kesti

Longtime OAA member Kay Kesti died on August 14 just a month short of her 90th birthday. She is survived by a daughter, Anne at 3793 Victor St., Pinole CA 94564. Kay was a member of OAA for as long as anyone can remember. she was usually in charge of Show take-ins. She sup-

ported the shows and the members in ways that were behind the curtains, but vital nonetheless. As a painter, her landscapes were memorable: dark and haunting trees moving against luminous skies. For many years Kay painted with the Wednesday Painters at the Kensington Community Center and when she could no longer

stand at her easel, she would have her caretaker bring her to lunch/critique time for the lively discussions.

Stan Cohen Publishes his Memoir Paintings:

"Stan's Story", is a series of paintings ten years long. When OAA sponsored a series of open critiques at the Millennium, I attended along with several other painters. My water colors were selling nicely and I expected to receive credit for great technical skill. Instead, Leonard Breger, (the Critic,) found reason to direct my efforts towards more personal, deeper paintings than mere decoration. I took his suggestions seriously and began a series of 62 canvases

that comprise a visual memoir titled, "Stan's Story". Each visual image is surrounded by written information and the pages are arranged chronologically, from earliest memory to present. With the help of a tech savvy artist, Emily Hawthorne, I had a number of copies printed and have sold enough at \$25, to defray the costs.

Exhibit Rules

RECEIVING: Friday November 22nd, 2013 from 10 AM until 11am at the Presbyterian Church, 4101 Park Blvd., Oakland. Enter parking lot from Hampel Street.

JUROR: To Be Determined (watch next months newsletter)

ACCEPTED WORKS: Pick up at the Presbyterian Church between 10 AM and 11 AM on Friday (Jan date TBD)

ENTRIES: Up to 2 entries will be accepted per member. Entries will be two dimensional; 12"x 12" min. and 36"x 36" max. - nominal size including mats.

Artworks depicting iconic scenes of San Francisco are not appropriate for this venue! If entered, artwork in this category may be rejected at the sole discretion of the show chairman.

Because only 7 "large" (i.e. over 24"X30") works can be displayed in the show space, only the first 7 "large" pieces will be accepted, unless specifically allowed by the Show Chair.

Works restricted to original work – no class work or copies. Nudes and political statements are not accepted (venue requirement). All work must be for sale. The Chamber reserves the right to reject any work from the show for any reason.

Any work shown at a Chamber of Commerce Show **prior to** August 2010 may be shown again at this show. Any work having won a cash award in any OAA show is not eligible to receive another cash award but may receive a merit award.

To be entered as a single work, any grouping of 2 or more works must be mounted within a single frame which meets the overall size requirements.

ENTRY FEE: \$8.00 per entry.

FRAMING: No wide (may not exceed 3") or elaborate frames will be accepted.

Mats must be clean and well cut and frames must be clean, sturdy and no protruding screw eyes or hangers will be allowed.

Works larger than 24" x 30" (if covered) must be under plastic instead of glass.

Entry Forms: Must be filled out completely and affixed to the upper left hand corner on the back of the entry.

PLEASE TYPE OR PRINT LEGIBLY!

AWARDS: First award \$125; Second award \$75; Third award \$50. Merit awards are given at the discretion of the Juror.

INSURANCE: A waiver must be signed on receiving day.

SALES:


All sales made during the show and/or 30days following the close of the show (if the work was seen by the buyer at the show) will be handled by the Sales Chairman Tina Nelson 925 256-6849.

OAA policy is that no change will be made in the price (in connection with this show) after the work is accepted. The artist agrees that 30% of the sale price will be taken as a contribution to OAA. Sales tax of 9% will be added to all sales.
